The May General Membership Meeting

For our May General Membership Meeting, we had our second annual Junior League of Grand Rapids volunteering blitz. We sent our entire membership out to volunteer at organizations around the city that support children's physical and emotional health, including Ele's Place, Alpha Women's Center, Closet of Hope, and the original JL Wellness Adventure Yard at the Wege Sojourner House for survivors of domestic violence.





This year, the Junior League of Grand Rapids sent 12 representatives to Lansing for our annual Day at the Capitol. Events included a presentation on childhood sexual assault by Tashmica Torok from The Firecracker Foundation, a panel discussion of former foster youth on how best to support those who have experienced foster care, a legislative open house luncheon where we met with representatives from Kent and Ottawa


counties, a presentation on human trafficking by Jessica Glynn from the Kalamazoo YWCA, and

a Senate Judiciary Committee hearing. During this hearing, we saw the committee unanimously pass a package of bills geared toward protecting children from perpetrators of sexual assault by: extending the statutes of limitation, increasing penalties for possessing child porngraphy, increasing the scope of mandated reporters, and increasing the penalties for failure to report abuse.
